Round 6 – 2023 Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit, VIC 27-29 October 2023

Please accept this as confirmation that your entry has been accepted for Round 6 of the 2023 mi-bike Motorcycle Insurance Australian Superbike Championship presented by Motul at Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit on October 27, 28 and 29 2023.

Your acceptance is on the condition that you accept and agree to abide by the ASBK Sporting Regulations, the Competitor Information kit and following instructions and conditions in these Final Instructions.

CREDENTIALS OFFICE

Credentials office will be located with the Gate 1 entry staff.

CIRCUIT ENTRY / BUMP IN AND CLOSING TIMES

Circuit Entry will be:

- via Gate 7 for both Thursday and Friday
- via Gate 1 for both Saturday and Sunday

Access for Competitors commences on Thursday from 11.00am and no later than 6.00pm for all classes.

Oversized Vehicle Entry will be via Gate 4 Gap Road from 11.00am To 5:00pm Thursday.

TEMPORARY STRUCTURES

It is the responsibility of the competitor to provide a structure which meets all Occupational Health and Safety, and Australian Engineering Standards. The temporary structure must be pegged and weighed down in a designated area. MA or ASBK Management take no responsibility for structures causing damage due to being secured insufficiently.

TRACK INSPECTION

Competitors are invited to inspect the track by walking only (no push bikes or scooters), on Thursday afternoon from 3.00pm to 5.00pm or Friday morning 6.45am – 7.15am.

In addition to the <u>no</u> push bikes/ scooters allowed for the Track Inspection, there are to be no Scooters or pushbikes within the Paddock Area

VEHICLE PASSES AND PARKING

Car Passes for each Rider/Team are to be collected at the Race Secretary's Office from 11.30am Thursday during the commencement of Sign-On. If not collected on Thursday or Friday, they will be available from Gate 1 prior to Circuit/Paddock Entry Gate from Saturday morning.

One x P1 Transporter Pass per rider will be issued for parking in the designated areas (rear of Pit Lane garages and front of support paddock garages). This includes vehicles for unloading equipment and fuel etc. Refer to Paddock Layout for Car Park details.

All other competitor vehicles & trailers will be issued with a P2 car pass sticker for parking in the competitor parking area located in the P2 Parking areas (map available on www.asbk.com.au / competitor info

Vehicle passes must be affixed to the Front Windscreen or hung on the rear-view mirror for series car passes of each vehicle. If the sticker is not attached to the windscreen, or not hung on the rear-view mirror for series car passes, you will be denied entry.

Any reports of poor or aggressive behaviour to Security, venue staff or officials is subject to sporting penalties under the ASBK Sporting Regulations.

Non-working vehicles, including rental and personal cars will not be eligible to park in the paddock, even if you have the Transporter Car Pass. These rental and personal cars must be parked in P2.

Please note: All fire lanes and service road must be kept clear at all times.

GARAGE ALLOCATIONS

Pit Boxes/Garages preference go to Superbike. Supersport and Supersport 300/ R3 competitors. The support paddock garages will be allocated to Superbike Masters and OJC competitors.

Please note: Due to constraints with the paddock layout at Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit, parking will be restricted. Competitors and support personnel are requested to please respect the parking requirements in place.

KEYS for all garages will be available for collection on Thursday from the Race Secretaries Office. It is the responsibility of the hirer to lock and unlock their garage each day. (There are no spare keys).

If sharing a pit box/garage, we recommend you make arrangements to leave the key end of day at the race admin office for collection in the morning.

A Deposit of \$100 will be required for pit box/garage keys (Cash or card will be accepted). Keys must be returned to the Race Secretary's Office no later than 5.00pm Sunday. If the key is lost or not returned the deposit will not be refunded and further penalties will be issued by ASBK and/or Phillip Island Circuit Management.

All competitors are required to affix their name, class, and rider number to the front of the carport. Sporting Regs 1.28.5

Please note: Your pit box/garage must be left clean of rubbish and debris when leaving the track. Used bike tyres cannot be left in your pit boxes/garages or in the paddock area. Any rider found to have left tyres in the pit box/garages or in the paddock area will be invoiced for their disposal cost and further penalties will be issued by ASBK Management.

Pit Lane - Pit Walk: All competitors and teams with pit box/garage allocations on Pit Lane are required to take part in the Spectator Pit Lane Walk to be held on Sunday during the lunch break. Further details on the requirements will be sent out via the Promotional Schedule and discussed in the Riders Briefing. Competitors that do not wish to take part in the Spectator Pit Lane walk must have a valid reason and must notify the Race Secretary, in writing by **Friday 26th October**.

COMPULSORY SIGN IN

ALL COMPETITORS, CREW MEMBERS, ENTRANTS AND PARENT/GUARDIANS must sign in at the ASBK Race Secretary's Office prior to attending Technical Inspection and any on track activity. If a rider, team manager or entrant does not sign-on prior to the rider going out on track, a penalty will apply.

Rider Sign in will be via an electronic system. Riders MUST bring their MA licence card or MA App to Sign-in. Crew members sign in will be done manually.

BRIEFINGS FOR RIDERS, TEAM MANAGER, ENTRANTS, PARENT/GUARDIANS

Compulsory Rider, Team Manager, Entrants, Parent/Guardian briefings will be held on Friday morning 27 October in the Muster Shed (Green Shed rear of paddock) at the following times:

Friday Briefing SSP300 / R3 / OJC and Superbike Masters	0725 - 0745
Friday Briefing SBK / SSP	0750 - 0805

Failure to attend the Briefings, sign the attendance register, or arrive late without an acceptable reason will result in a fine, penalties and possible exclusion from the meeting.

This applies also to All Team Managers, Entrants, Parents and or Guardians.

The nominated Entrant for any rider MUST sign-on to activate their representation of their rider. Failure to sign-on and attend the briefing may result in exclusion from any representation of the rider.

Note to Superbike & Supersport Competitors Round 6 - Compulsory Sports Integrity Meeting

Sports Integrity Australia will be holding a compulsory seminar for <u>all</u> Superbike and Supersport riders on **Friday at 4:45pm** in the Muster Shed (green Shed rear of paddock). It is highly recommended for any other rider who is not in Superbike or Supersport if you are planning on competing overseas this year.

OFFICIAL TYRE ALLOCATION

Pirelli, Dunlop, Bridgestone and Michelin will provide tyre service.

Tyres for Superbike, Supersport-and Supersport 300 are available to competitors and must be selected from the 2023 ASBK Tyre Homologation List.

TECHNICAL INSPECTION

ASBK Technical Inspection will commence on Thursday from approximately 2.00pm – 5.30pm

Technical Inspection will continue Friday morning at the following times:

Note: Oceania Junior Cup competitors must take their safety apparel to the technical inspection area

ALL competitors must take their safety apparel to the technical Inspection area at times listed above.

Rear stand MUST be provided by the team for each machine to complete ASBK Technical Inspection.

Competitors are to submit their machines in accordance with Sporting Regulations V11.

Damaged Helmet Procedure – In the event of a crash, all competitors Helmets that are involved in an incident will be inspected by ASBK Technical. If a helmet is determined to be not suitable for further use, the helmet will be impounded and not returned to the competitor till the end of the meeting.

NOISE RESTRICTIONS – STARTING OF ENGINES

No Engines are to be run before 9.00am and after 5.00pm on any day of the event.

RACE NUMBERS

Unless you have been notified by the Race Secretary or MA Office, your allocated race number is as per your entry registration and/or the latest version of the Allocated Numbers document. Race Number decals are available for purchase from the ASBK Race Secretary's Office at \$2 per number.

ASBK LOGO PATCH ON LEATHERS

All ASBK competitors are required to display an ASBK Logo patch on their leathers. Refer ASBK Sporting regulations 1.15.6. ASBK patches will be available from the ASBK Race Secretary Office.

WRIST BANDS & CREW MEMBER LICENCES

All Crew members requiring access to pit lane, or the signalling area including access the Media Grid (Pit Wall/Signal area) must present to the Race Secretary Office and sign-on.

- Crew members wishing to gain access to the grid must hold either a valid crew or senior national licence and wear their ASBK issued identification bands on the wrist for all 3 days.
- A **maximum** of 5 wristbands per rider will be issued to Superbike and Supersport, excluding the rider but including one (1) Promotional staff crew members.
- Access for each class crew member is only during relevant practice sessions, qualifying sessions, and races. Any
 unlicenced Crew Members who are required on media grid must report to the Race Secretary's prior to any grid
 activity.

CREW MEMBER LICENCE PRE-EVENT APPLICATION

It is highly recommended that Crew licences are applied for prior to the weekend. Annual crew licences can be applied for via Ridernet. Crew member sign-in will be done manually at the Race Secretary's Office.

MEDIA GRIDS

All Superbike and Supersport races will have a media grids. Each rider will be restricted to a maximum of 4 crew people and 1 promotional staff which are identifiable by their wristbands.

- A MA crew licence is required. Please ensure your crew members have applied for this no later than Friday.
- Crew members are not permitted to work on motorcycle after the 3 minutes siren. Penalties may apply.
- Crew members (and media personnel) need to be clear of their motorcycle and clear of the grid by the one-minute siren. Penalties may apply.

The Promotional Staff is restricted to:

- Umbrella duties only and may not touch the motorcycle in anyway (penalties to apply)
- Must be formally nominated by the rider/team to the Race Sec, prior to Saturday 4pm.
- Must sign-on and the holder of a MA licence (like all others on the grid with a team)
- Must be dressed to the standards of the promotional staff policy.
- Must clear the grid upon instruction of the officials.

PIT LANE / WORKING IN PIT LANE AND ACCESS TO PIT LANE WALL.

Refer to Sporting Regulations 3.5

- No personnel will be allowed on pit wall at the start of a race. Once the field has passed the start line, only Team members in control of pit boards will be allowed on the pit wall.
- Strictly Only Two (2) personnel per team will be allowed on pit wall.
- Teams must leave the signalling area when other classes are on track.
- NOTE: Only those on Pit wall in the Signalling area and pit lane with either an MA issued Crew or senior National Licence, along with the correct wristband will be covered under MA's personal accident insurance coverage.
- Speed limit in pit lane is maximum 40km/h. The restricted Speed Zone does not finish until the sign and white line at after the control tower.
- Speed in the paddock is 6 km/h with a helmet to be worn at all times.

ACCESS TO AND EXIT FROM TRACK

Competitors located in the pit lane Pit Boxes may join in all sessions and races from the front of their pit bays, after the conclusion of the prior session.

All other competitors will enter via Pit Lane. During practice/qualifying sessions and races competitors may use the pit lane for pit stops and only immediately prior to and during these sessions, the appropriate pit-crews for each of their session. All equipment must be promptly removed when the session ends. Service vehicles are not permitted in pit lane.

Riders located in the support paddock are not permitted to ride their bike past the canteen. Riders must dismount their bike (engine off) and push the bike past the canteen.

Exit from Track At the end of every session of practice, qualifying, warmups and racing; all bikes are to exit the track at Turn 4. A full explanation of circuit access and exit for all competitors will be given at Riders Briefing.

For all qualifying and racing sessions, competitors must return to their pits via the Technical Inspection Bay unless otherwise directed.

WARM UP LAPS

All Competitors will be given one (1) sighting and one (1) warm-up lap for each event with the exception of OJC and Superbike Masters competitors who will be given one (1) warm up lap only.

PARC FERME AND PODIUM PRESENTATIONS

Top 3 riders only must enter the podium area. Parc Ferme and Podium Presentations will be located on the north side of the Technical Inspection area.

MEDICAL SERVICES

The event will be providing an experienced Medical Services. Racesafe Medical Team will be in attendance during all ASBK sessions. The Medical Centre is located to the rear of the Main Paddock (towards Turn 12 end).

Emergency Ambulances will also attend this round.

All Competitors (if not having done so) must complete the 2023 Racesafe medical history form and submit to ASBK Event Manager via email prior the Thursday of the event, send to track@ma.org.au or present completed form to the Race Secretary's office no later than Friday morning. (form available from www.asbk.com.au). Information provided on this form will be kept strictly confidential.

A concussion policy will be in place and applied at all rounds. Contact Racesafe for more information or detail on the concussion policy.

TIMING

Transponders will be available for collection from the Race Secretary's office in the bottom level of the control tower on THURSDAY afternoon from 3:30pm and FRIDAY morning from 7:15am. No security deposits are required.

Transponder mounting brackets are available for sale for \$12 each (GST incl) – EFTPOS and credit card ONLY – NO CASH.

Where you have not organized and paid for a second transponder for your spare bike as part of your entry, and want to hire one, these are available for \$25 each (GST incl) – EFTPOS and credit card ONLY – NO CASH.

CIRCUIT CATERING

The onsite catering will operate from Friday to Sunday inclusive from the infield canteen.

CIRCUIT CAMPING

Overnight Camping at the circuit is not allowed.

BURNOUT POLICY

There is a no burnout policy anywhere within the circuit confines. Penalties, fines and banned from future events may be imposed by ASBK Management or the ASBK Race Director.

TRUCK WASHING

There is no truck washing on site at Phillip Island GP Circuit.

PROMOTIONAL SCHEDULE

Riders and teams are reminded to follow the information and directive of the Promotional Schedule. Failure to do so may result in penalties by ASBK Race Direction.

OHS

All competitors must comply with the OHS Safety and Compliance Phillip Island GP Circuit and any state government regulations. Including, but limited too.

- (Fire Safety) You must provide suitable fire safety equipment (including fire extinguishers and fire blankets) having regard to the nature of your business to be undertaken at the Stall and must comply with all laws, regulations and directions or policies of Circuit in relation to fire prevention and emergency evacuation procedures. All LPG bottles you bring onto the site must comply with relevant laws, standards and regulations.
- (Incident Reporting) You must immediately report all accidents, emergencies and incidents to Circuit and provide Circuit
- (Compliance with Laws) At all times while on Site you must ensure that your Personnel comply with all laws, regulations, codes and standards applicable to the Site, your business or the Event including without limitation Work Health and Safety Laws.

CLEANING AND WASTE DISPOSAL

At All times during the event, you must:

- Keep your garage and the area around it clean, tidy and free from waste
- Dispose of all waste in the bins provided
- Not dispose of any liquid waste on-site except with the prior consent and in accordance with directions of Phillip Island GP Circuit
- Upon conclusion of the Event, remove all waste and return the garage and area around it to the condition as at the commencement of the Bump-In period and remedy all damage caused to the garage and the area around it (fair wear and tear excepted)
